
Nothing authentic, nothing genuine, nothing fun. Just a pretty face.

Led by Heather Smith, the group discussed the pros and cons of possible sites, designs, materials, storage, security, developing a set of rules and finding sources of funding.


Key questions were asked about what kind of gardens should be set up - what should we grow? - and what kinds of benefits it could bring to the community - why will people come here? what do people want or need?

March


A milestone is marked when Tony Gloag announces he is stepping down as Ōmārama Saleyards director, a role he has held for 50 years.


